Mia's Story

Mia has cerebral palsy. When she first enrolled in Capable Kids, she had poor head control, was unable to sit or roll over, and used a feeding tube for nutrition. The doctors and therapists were not optimistic about Mia's future. In fact, they told the family that Mia would likely not be able to attend public schools when she was older. Mia's family borrowed many pieces of positioning equipment from Capable Kids and quickly began to see her motor skills improve. She began holding her head up and was soon able to sit. The family continued to borrow equipment and work with Mia's therapist to help her progress and develop.

Today, Mia is 5 years old and knows her colors and numbers. She loves to put puzzles together and enjoys pretend play. Mia frequently teases her family and therapists. She is quite opinionated and recently began to use a communication device to be sure everyone knows what she wants. Mia is making rapid developmental gains and looks forward to attending school soon!

Sometimes, we just need a little advice....

A childcare provider enrolled in TCP's Early Childhood program needed some advice. She was caring for a little girl who was unable to keep any food down. Although the provider had tried a number of techniques, none were successful. The child seemed to be losing weight and the provider was quite concerned. TCP staff recommended that the provider share her concerns directly with the family and provided her with resources to help the family understand the significance of weight loss at such a young age. They also gave the provider information about programs to assist the family with medical bills and baby formula.

The provider shared her concerns and helped the family arrange an appointment with a local doctor. The doctor immediately sent the child to the hospital for treatment. The child was prescribed a different formula and began to gain weight. The provider thanked TCP for listening to her, helping her feel more confident about her observations, and for encouraging her to act on her instincts about the child's health.

Bobby's Story

Bobby was severely abused by his parents and entered foster care at the age of 5. He lived in several residential programs and moved to a group home when he turned 15. Bobby participated in TCP's Chafee program while in high school. He learned many life skills while in the program, such as cooking, managing a bank account, and how to complete job applications. Bobby's dream was to become a heavy equipment operator after he graduated from high school. He wanted to attend the 11- month Heavy Equipment Operations program at State Tech. The Chafee program helped him through each step of the application process. Bobby was accepted and was soon learning to operate bulldozers and backhoes. He completed the program and quickly landed the job of his dreams.

Today, Bobby is employed full-time as a heavy machinery operator. He travels all over the state and enjoys his work. Bobby is appreciative of the support he received when he was younger, and is proud of all that he achieved.

Grace was 17 years old when she enrolled in PLUS 1. She was a high school dropout, pregnant, and in foster care. Her future did not look very promising. However, Grace's boyfriend had a good job and they wanted to get married. Grace asked to be released from foster care and allowed to marry her boyfriend. Soon after they married, Grace's husband was injured at work and lost his job. The young couple suddenly had no income and a baby on the way.

Grace turned to the PLUS 1 staff for advice and support. They helped her set goals for her family and referred her to the Youth 180 program. This program allowed Grace to earn money to support her family while completing HiSet classes to obtain her high school equivalency certificate. After accomplishing this goal, Grace went on to attend Metro Business College and received her certificate in medical billing and coding. PLUS 1 staff encouraged Grace to apply for a job at Phelps Health and she was offered the position. With the support and guidance of PLUS 1, Grace has been able to accomplish each goal she sets. Her future looks very bright!
